HCIA Executive Vice Presi- dent James Ronquillo asked for a	show of hands during the organi- zation's April 7 meeting. About 20 members said they would vote to continue tolls, while only one person voted against doing so. But HCIA members set certain conditions: ▶ The tolls will be extended for only five years. ▶ A cap will be placed on the op-	erating budget of the Crescent City Connection division. ► Any money collected after that cap is met must be used for West Bank roadway projects, including upgrading Peters Road in Har- vey. Tolls on the span expire June 30, unless the Legislature re- imposes them.	It's April 14; do you know where your tax return is?
